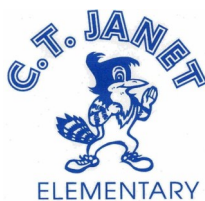
Parents, if any money is owed to the school for lost books, childcare, etc., please settle those debts as soon as possible. Student records, including report cards will not be released until that time.

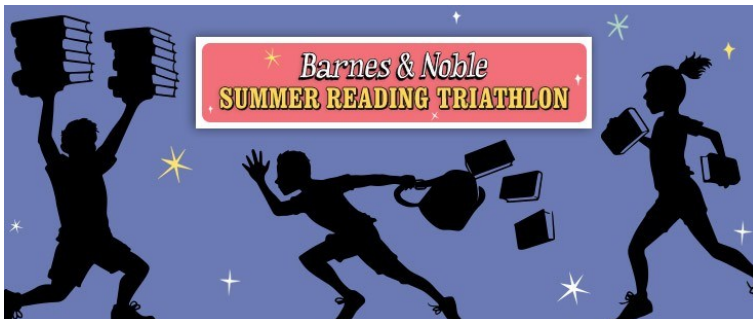
